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Night 1 – Embarkation & Check Dive

Embark in Sharm El Sheikh and settle into life onboard. After safety briefings and equipment preparation, enjoy a relaxed meal and evening onboard before sailing out the following morning.

Day 1 – Local Reefs, Sha’ab Mahmoud, and Abu Nuhas

The week begins with a check dive at a local reef before sailing to Sha’ab Mahmoud for a leisurely dive on the famous Dunraven wreck. From there, cross to Abu Nuhas, a reef renowned for its spectacular wreck diving. The Carnatic, an easy and stunning wreck dive, is a top pick for day one. Moor overnight at Abu Nuhas, where a night dive may be offered on Abu Nuhas’ reef. On the first day, the sites are chosen based on conditions and group experience, offering excellent opportunities to refine buoyancy, photography skills, and underwater awareness while enjoying Red Sea wrecks, vibrant coral reefs, and abundant marine life.

Day 2 – Abu Nuhas

Explore the famous wrecks of Abu Nuhas, including Kimon M, Chrysoula K, and Giannis D. In the evening, a night dive may be offered on either a wreck or the main reef, depending on group experience, weather, and sea conditions.

Day 3 – Abu Nuhas & Gubal

Start the day with an early morning dive on Giannis D before sailing to Gubal Island over breakfast. Dive the Ulysses by zodiac, followed by afternoon and night dives on the Barge just one giant stride from the back deck.

Day 4 – Gubal

Enjoy up to three dives on the Rosalie Moller, depending on conditions, diver experience, and certification levels.

Day 5 – Shag Rock and Sha’ab Ali

Begin with an early morning dive on the Kingston before continuing to the legendary SS Thistlegorm, one of the most famous wreck dives in the world. Multiple dives allow divers to explore the cargo holds, military vehicles, motorcycles, and locomotive while discovering the rich marine life that now inhabits the wreck. The first dive will take in the upper structure and deck area. Subject to conditions and local regulations, a night dive to the upper structure and deck may also be possible.

Day 6 – Final Reef Dives & Return to Port

Early morning at the SS Thistlegorm followed by Shark & Yolanda, and if time permits, a local dive before returning to port. Sites are selected according to conditions and flight schedules, providing a relaxed finish to a fantastic week of Northern Red Sea diving. The afternoon is spent preparing equipment, logging dives, and enjoying the final evening onboard or at a hotel.
